# SWISS EDUCATION EXCELLENCE







Switzerland is a small and yet highly diversified country: languages, cultures, economic sectors and landscapes vary within a very small area. But Switzerland is also a cosmopolitan country. Around a quarter of the population holds a foreign passport, the economy is strongly exportoriented and numerous international organizations are based in Switzerland.

The quality of the education system and the creativity of researchers are crucial to Switzerland's innovative strength and economic competitiveness. The public and private sectors continuously devote considerable resources to maintaining and expanding Switzerland's internationally successful position as a location for education and research in many different fields.

Switzerland attaches great importance to internationally competitive higher education institutions that cater to the needs of both individuals and national social needs. Such institutions ensure that Switzerland remains a key location for research and economic activities. The diversity of the Swiss higher education sector, which includes tier-one universities (T1), universities of applied sciences (UAS) and universities of teacher education (UTEs) developed over time. Put simply, it is based on the distinction between a purely academic focus of institutions and study programs and one that is more centered on equipping students with the knowledge, skills and know-how to work in specific professions. This yields differences in terms of standard admission requirements, research orientation and standard qualifications awarded by T1, UAS and UTEs.

The quality of the education system and the creativity of researchers are crucial to Switzerland's innovative strength and economic competitiveness.

# Modelled after the structure of English-speaking universities

Study programs at Swiss higher education institutions are based on the three-tiered Bachelor, Master and PhD model. PhD studies take place at federal institutes of technology and cantonal universities.



# Higher education institutions founded from the 15th to the 21st century

Founded in 1460, the University of Basel is the oldest Swiss higher education institution; UAS Graubunden came into existence in its present form only in 2020.



### Albert Einstein & Co.

Albert Einstein, became a Swiss citizen in 1901 and worked in Switzerland for many years, awarded the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1921. He is one of a long list of Swiss Nobel Prize laureates in the natural sciences that began with Emil Theodor Kocher (Nobel Prize for Medicine in 1909). To date, 25 scientists holding Swiss citizenship have received a Nobel Prize in the natural sciences. Measured in terms of population size, this is a world record.




# Switzerland is the most innovative country


In Switzerland's universities, diversity thrives with a gender balance of 48% male and 52% female students, alongside a significant 34.2% of the student body composed of foreign nationals.







From student to CEO: Equipping the next generation of business owners

While Ms Huilin Quek, CEO of Q Industries, always had her sights on pursuing theatre, she was drawn to the passion, genuine human connections and camaraderie exemplified by both front- and back-of-house team members in delivering immersive, seamless customer experiences. 

In addition to developing their own brand of products, Huilin led the team on a journey to digitalize their key markets in Singapore and Vietnam and this culminated in the launch of Q Online Solutions, a digital procurement platform. Her agile and sharp critical thinking skills and rapid adaptability during the challenging times of COVID not only anchored their role as an integrated solutions provider, but also safeguarded it through the disruptions of a pandemic.

### Stepping up as the next generation leader, with EHL


She believes that EHL's deep practical skills training and industry focused learning led by an expert panel of faculty, and international exposure through the student body, alumni network and internship opportunities are key ingredients of success for anyone keen on a global management role. # SINGAPORE – ETH CENTRE





The Singapore-ETH Centre was established in 2010 by ETH Zurich and Singapore's National Research Foundation (NRF), as part of the NRF's CREATE campus.

ETH Zurich itself regularly features in international rankings as one of the best universities in the world. When the rankings are differentiated by specialist areas, ETH Zurich is in the first twelve for Science and Engineering in the THE and QS listings.

The Swiss University has also produced 32 Nobel laureates, including Albert Einstein, who was a professor at ETH Zurich from 1912 to 1914. Together with academic excellence and research, it is a highly attractive destination for students and researchers across the world.



The Singapore-ETH Centre was set up as a research hub for researchers and students from all over the world to collaborate on research to tackle the world's most pressing challenges. The centre brings together over 250 researchers from diverse disciplines under our programmes – Future Cities Lab Global, Future Resilient Systems and Future Health Technologies – and more than 10 projects, such as Cooling Singapore and Urban Microalgae-Based Protein Production.

As ETH Zurich's only research center in Asia, outside Switzerland, the SEC is set in the rapidly urbanizing ASEAN region. Researchers at the SEC work closely with partner universities, governmental institutions, industry and the community to develop practical solutions for society.

### **RESEARCH PROGRAMS**

### Future Cities Lab Global

Future Cities Lab Global (FCLG) is the first program of the Singapore-ETH Centre where science and design are combined to develop new knowledge, technologies and approaches for a sustainable urban future. The program helps to shape sustainable cities and settlement systems through science, by design, in place, over time.

### Future Resilient Systems

Future Resilient Systems (FRS) addresses the challenges of increasing interconnectedness and complexity of infrastructure systems, which provide energy, transport, communication, finance, production, and other essential services to modern societies. It aims to enhance the resilience of urban systems by combining engineering, design and social research.

### Future Health Technologies

Future Health Technologies (FHT) develops an evidence-based mobile digital health technology concept to transform the healthcare system towards health by prevention and a community-based and patient-centric model, leveraging on scalable digital technologies. The program combines new technologies such as big data, artificial intelligence and robotics to develop holistic mobile digital health solutions designed to carry clinical intelligence beyond the hospital.

### **Cooling Singapore**


Cooling Singapore is a multi-disciplinary research project dedicated to developing solutions to address the urban heat challenge in Singapore.

# ST.GALLEN INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT IN ASIA -SGI-HSG





Located in a shophouse on Amoy Street, in the heart of Singapore's Chinatown district, the St.Gallen Institute of Management in Asia (SGI-HSG) serves as the local institute of the University of St.Gallen (HSG) in Asia and has over 10 team members permanently based in Singapore.

With more than 9'000 students the HSG itself sets global standards for research and teaching by promoting integrative thought, responsible action, and an entrepreneurial spirit of innovation in business and society. As a public university, they offer various Bachelor, Master, and PhD programmes in the fields of business administration, economics, finance, law, management as well as international affairs.

The University of St.Gallen is consistently ranked among the Top 10 European Business Schools and has with the Master in Strategy and International Management (SIM) a program, that has been recognized with the worldwide No.1 position in the prestigious Global Masters in Management Ranking of the Financial Times for many years.

Since its founding in 2011, the SGI-HSG has served as a platform for Asia-related teaching, research, and services. The institute seeks to foster a wider exchange between Asia and Europe, enabling a deeper mutual understanding of cultures, regions, and economies between Singapore and Switzerland. Each year, the institute welcomes over 450 participants in various programs, ranging from high school students to senior executives.



### **OUR VISION**


The SGI-HSG's vision is to connect students and faculty members of the University of St.Gallen with Asia, specifically Singapore at all levels of higher education, characterized by a practical approach and integrative view. The institute aims to open students' and faculty's eyes for Asia and continental Europe respectively, through exchange, teaching, learning together and specific research.

The HSG seeks collaborations with local partner universities to allow students to spend part of their academic career in Singapore. The institute strives to be St.Gallen's platform to facilitate those collaborations through a permanent presence in Singapore.

### LONG STANDING RELATIONSHIPS WITH SINGAPORE

Since the first academic partnerships with Singaporean universities were established in 1997, the HSG chose not just to observe the Asian century, but decided to become part of it. In 2003, the HSG established a partnership with the Singapore Management University (SMU) by introducing the Asia Term, a comprehensive exchange program in Singapore, for HSG's undergraduate students. This partnership was the starting point of a long-term and trust based relationship between SMU and HSG. Over the past decade, the HSG's activities in Singapore have culminated in a broad portfolio of programs and services, and it has led to an extensive and committed network of partners.

In 2011, the University of St.Gallen decided to institutionalize these collaborations by setting up its own institute with permanent faculty and researchers residing in Singapore. The establishment of the SGI-HSG was strongly supported by the local HSG alumni community.





### **TEACHING**


The courses offered at the SGI-HSG focus on business contexts in Asia, equipping students with the skills to understand opportunities and challenges in this increasingly important region. The institute's teaching activities include courses on the bachelor's and master's levels as well as executive education programs. The main programs offered are the Asia Term on the bachelor and Asia Compact courses on the master level. For some programs, like the Asia Term, the institute collaborates with local partners. Other courses are independently offered by SGI-HSG faculty.

### **SUMMER SCHOOLS**

The Summer School in Asia offers adult high school students and recent graduates the opportunity to discover Singapore, one of Asia's most exciting cities. Additionally, we are also offering the chance to discover Europe's SME heartland during our Summer School in Switzerland for Asian students. During two weeks of courses in both programs, students acquire the tools and methods to successfully navigate the university experience and other post-high school plans. Our programs are packed with input sessions by HSG faculty and guest speakers, company visits, group work, social events, and much more. The programs will be held in Singapore and St.Gallen, typically in July.

### **ASIA TERM**

The Asia Term is the flagship exchange program of the HSG at the bachelor level and usually takes place every year from August till December with up to 70 St.Gallen students joining us in Singapore. The program provides students with an in-depth knowledge of Asia. Asia Term core courses are designed with high practical relevance to the Asian business context. Diverse formats such as consulting projects, company visits, and guest lectures allow Asia Term students to combine theory with practice and learn about business in a hands-on manner together with local students. The Asia Term is fully integrated into the curriculum of Singapore Management University (SMU) giving students a seamless experience for course crediting and selection.



### **ASIA COMPACT**

Asia Compact courses are master-level offerings that address various topics in the Asian context. Scheduled during semester breaks, Asia Compact courses take place in Singapore and allow for company visits, guest talks from local business insiders, and cultural exposure all at the same time. With an electrifying city state as the "classroom," Asia Compacts aspire to confer to students industry, market, and societal insights through interactive sessions and fieldwork in addition to lectures and case studies.


### **EXECUTIVE EDUCATION**





### **Early Childhood**

### Little Tots

Our Little Tots are an English-speaking program for children aged two to three. We offer a fun, supportive atmosphere in small groups of up to eight children. Our Little Tots learn to socialize with their peers and prepare for their future schooling. Sand play, sports, music and water activities are integral parts of the program.

### Playgroup

Our Playgroup is an English-speaking program for children aged three to four. The focus is on learning through play, both independently, in small groups and often as a whole class. We use a theme-based approach that helps children to recognize and understand themselves, their bodies and their environment. Through this approach they develop confidence and self-esteem. ### **Swiss Universities**

### The umbrella organization of the Swiss universities

If you have an academic baccalaureate, you can study at a Swiss higher education institute. There are three types of higher education institutions in Switzerland.

### University / Federal Institute of Technology

Students who go to a university or a federal institute of technology learn the scientific basis of their area of study. There are two federal institutes of technology: the Federal Institute of Technology in Zurich (ETH Zurich) and the Federal Institute of Technology in Lausanne (EPFL). An academic baccalaureate from a baccalaureate school provides direct access to university.

### **University of Applied Sciences**

Students who go to a university of applied sciences acquire practice- and application-based knowledge. A federal vocational baccalaureate or a specialized baccalaureate provides direct access to a university of applied sciences.

### Universities of Teacher Education

Universities of teacher education and training train teaching staff.

You can apply directly to a higher education institution. The website of the umbrella organization of the Swiss universities provides the contact information of the higher education institutions, admission requirements, housing, etc).


